



DREAMS for Duchenne

Launched by Entrada in 2023, DREAMS is a competitive annual grant program that funds non-profit organizations' efforts to advance equity, inclusion and accessibility within the Duchenne muscular dystrophy community. The program supports projects focused on better identifying, understanding and reaching individuals with Duchenne who are currently underrepresented or underserved, with the goal of improving equitable access to care and health outcomes.



DREAMS and Belonging

Two Nonprofits, One Shared Mission

Two non-profit organizations will each receive a \$50,000 USD grant to fund projects that advance equity, accessibility and inclusion for individuals with Duchenne. Entrada will award one grant to a U.S.-based non-profit and another to a non-profit in the U.K. or EU.

Program Info and Requirements

Eligibility Requirements

To apply, your organization must:

- a. Be a registered non-profit in the U.S., U.K. or EU*
- b. Provide services to people with Duchenne muscular dystrophy, or will work closely with the Duchenne community as part of this grant
- c. Submit a grant request focused on advancing equity, inclusion and accessibility within the Duchenne community
- d. Not have received a DREAMS Grant within the last two years

* EU countries include Austria, Belgium, Bulgaria, Croatia, Cyprus, Czechia, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Ireland, Italy, Latvia, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malta, Netherlands, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain and Sweden. All applicants will be asked to provide documents that confirm your organization's non-profit status.

Application Process and Requirements

As a first step, you will need to complete the Interest Form to ensure your organization meets the above eligibility requirements. All applicants will receive a response, and all organizations that meet the above eligibility requirements will then receive an email with a link to the full application. In the full application, you will need to provide detailed information about your project, including:

- Your project's goals and objectives
- How it will advance equity, inclusion and accessibility within the Duchenne muscular dystrophy community for those who are currently underrepresented or underserved
- A clear plan for implementation and outreach
- An attached budget in an Excel format

Only one application per non-profit organization will be considered. Grant recipients will enter into a written agreement with Entrada Therapeutics that reviews the basic conditions of the grant. The only attachment that will be accepted is an Excel file for your project's budget; additional attachments (such as PDF proposals) will not be reviewed.

Final applications must be submitted by 11:59 pm EDT on July 9, 2026.

Review Criteria

An Independent Grant Review Committee, consisting of neuromuscular specialists, patient advocates and health equity advocates, is responsible for reviewing and selecting the grant recipients. Recipient selection will be managed as an independent process, and Entrada has no input into the reviewers' decisions.

Each submitted application will be anonymized and provided to the Independent Grant Review Committee, who will review, score and rank applications using the following criteria:

Project Overview

How clearly does the project align with the mission of promoting inclusivity, equity and accessibility within the Duchenne community?

Addressing Community Needs

- How well does the project identify and address critical needs in the Duchenne community, particularly those faced by historically underrepresented groups, through accessible, impactful services or solutions?
- To what extent does the project demonstrate potential for long-term, transformative impact through meaningful partnerships with historically underrepresented and/or local community groups?

Implementation and Outreach Plan

How clear and feasible is the project's implementation plan, including timeline, key activities and strategies for engaging the Duchenne community?

Expected Impact

- How strong is the project's overall impact strategy, including defined outcomes, methods for evaluation and potential for long-term, transformative change for individuals within the Duchenne community?
- What deliverables or other outcomes are expected during the one-year grant term?

Organizational Structure

To what extent does the organization demonstrate and/or aim to demonstrate the experience, partnerships and resources necessary to effectively serve the Duchenne community, including historically underrepresented populations?

Budget and Funding Use

How detailed, realistic and aligned is the proposed budget in supporting the goals and implementation of the project?
